

## **School Report 2022- 2023**

The students joined the physical school in April 2022 after a gap of two years due to COVID pandemic. Children added life and vitality to the school, but the challenge was that they returned with huge learning gaps. With great contentment, we affirm that we have brought our children back to the rhythm of learning—all praise to the dedication and hard work of the teachers.

Apart from preparing the children for academic demands, we emphasised on preparing our students to face the challenges of the competitive world. We are proud that three students have cleared the most coveted seats by clearing JEE and NEET exams. Harshita Makhija secured a place in the prestigious Lady Harding College, College, whereas Piyush Jain and Aman Singh Gill made their place in IIT BHU and IIT Kanpur, respectively.

Speaking of academic excellence, I am glad to mention the students' performance in class X and XII board examination examinations.

The class XII topper from the science stream was Kriti Jain with 97.8 %, followed by Nipun Kothari @ 96.8 and Diya Mehta @95.8. The Commerce stream topper, Mihika Gupta, closed at 97.4, Kashish Jain at 97 and Nitaya verma at 96.6%. The humanities students did not lag either and made their way to the merit list scoring 95.4% Krishna Vashishth, followed by Devsena Pal and Priya with 95.4 and 94.4%, respectively. The class X toppers also shined away to glory with their stellar performances. Krati Mishra, Riddhima Mishra, and Krish Jain made their way to the toppers list with 99.2, 98.4 and 98%, respectively. This year the number of merit certificates of students scoring a perfect 100 was way up compared to previous years. There were 12 merit certificates in class X and 13 in class XII.

Many students brought laurels to the school by bagging many prizes at the inter-school and zonal levels. Two students represented the school at the state level – Anwasha Mandal of class XII in Instrumental and Arushi of class XII in Classical Vocal.

The school lived up to its yearly theme -Techno 2022- Create and Innovate by organising inter-school inter-school events like ATL Community Day and ATL FestFest – Technothon 1.0. The school also organised inter-house activities like

debates on Cyber wars, Human body engineering, and developing and designing robots. Each month of the session was dedicated to the sub-themes sub-themes like – Accolade of Women in STEM, a revolution in mankind through Artificial Intelligence, IoT, ML and many other activities. Last year's year's school theme – India – Our Pride and Our Honour, culminated on 15 August 2022 with much gaiety and fanfare to celebrate 75 years of India's India's Independence.

The school made a mark at national level competitions too. Simmar Sandhu of class IX was selected in the CBSE Science exhibition with the model – Enzo – The Medical Support, Vanshika Sharma, class XI cleared CBSE Heritage Quiz and represented the school at the national level, and Kamyra Juneja, Class V, won the prize in the CBSE Expression series. Riya Sammi of class IX stood first in pan India UTOPIA – A Thematic painting competition as a part of CBSE Adolescent Summit 2022. CBSE and UNICEF felicitated the school for successfully completing the pilot project - P2E (Passport to Earning): A Program by CBSE and UNICEF for preparing students for Employment and Life.

An online exchange programme was conducted with a Japanese school called Oberlin School, wherein both schools presented the highlights of their country's country's rich cultural heritage.

This year, despite the challenges, the school tried integrating as many activities as possible in different classes. The primary courses had their regular class assemblies on various themes. In consonance with NEP 2020, bagless days were organised with many activities like pottery, carpentry, cooking, art etc., to upskill the students for a better future. To instil the importance of reading, many activities were organised, like classes VII and VIII celebrated 25 years of Harry Potter, whereas primary classes had Sudha Murthy as the author of the year. Students also attended the Kathakar International Story Telling Festival at Sunder Nursery Nursery. As a regular feature of the school, MGMUN was organised with five committees for the students to develop public speaking, writing, research and negotiating skills. Mr Jitin Chawla held career counselling workshops to help students choose the right career path based on their educational and professional choices and focus on foreign pastures. A specialised counselling session on CUET was also organised to apprise and better prepare students for the ongoing changes in the selection criteria at the university level.

The Recognition Day for the senior students was organised in January to felicitate all the young achievers of the school, and the Sports Day for the junior school was organised on the school campus with great zeal and enthusiasm.

The school also had a few budding authors who tried to make an indelible mark through the mighty power of the pen and got it published through bribooks publications. Siddhant Sinha of class IX book – "I Failed to Find Her" was felicitated at NPSC lit fest, and he got an opportunity to meet and listen to the scintillating literati of India.
